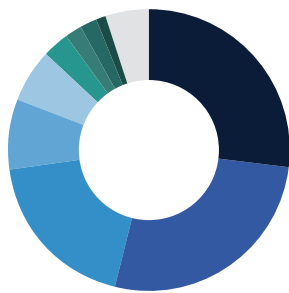


Post-Event Report

24 June 2025 | London, England

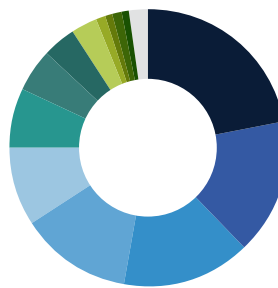

Event Demographics



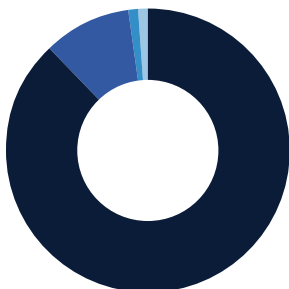

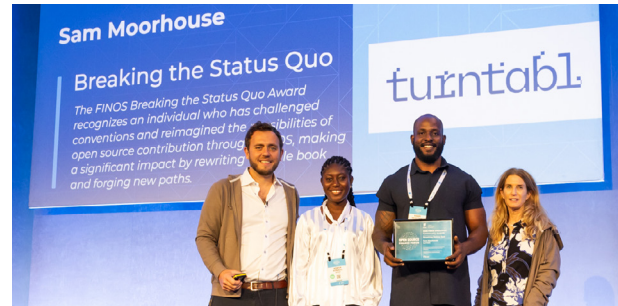

The Open Source in Finance Forum London received the highest rated Gold Badge from the CHAOSS D&I Event Badging Program, showing that we foster healthy D&I practices.

Our initiatives for inclusion and accessibility included the following:

- **Registration Scholarships:** To encourage and increase the participation of the community, we were pleased to offer scholarships to this year's event. Full conference registration was covered for 3 recipients.
- **All-Gender Restrooms:** Specific restrooms were dedicated as all-gender for attendees who feel more comfortable using all-gender facilities.
- **Inclusive Speaker Orientation Course & Accessibility Resources for Speakers:** Presentation accessibility resources and access to the Linux Foundation's online orientation course to learn tips/tools to use when speaking to encourage inclusivity in presentations and messaging were provided to all speakers.
- **Nursing Room:** A private nursing room was made available at the event to aid in the comfort and accessibility for our nursing attendees.
- **Communication Stickers:** Communication stickers were available for attendees to indicate their requested level of interaction with both other attendees and the press (including photographers and videographers).
- **Quiet Room:** A dedicated quiet room for sensory relaxation, meditation, and worship was available for all attendees. Attendees could go if, for any reason, they couldn't interact with other attendees at that time.
- **Pronoun Stickers:** Pronoun stickers were available for attendees to share their pronouns with other conference attendees.
- **Reserved Seating:** Reserved seating was available in each session room for those with accessibility needs.
