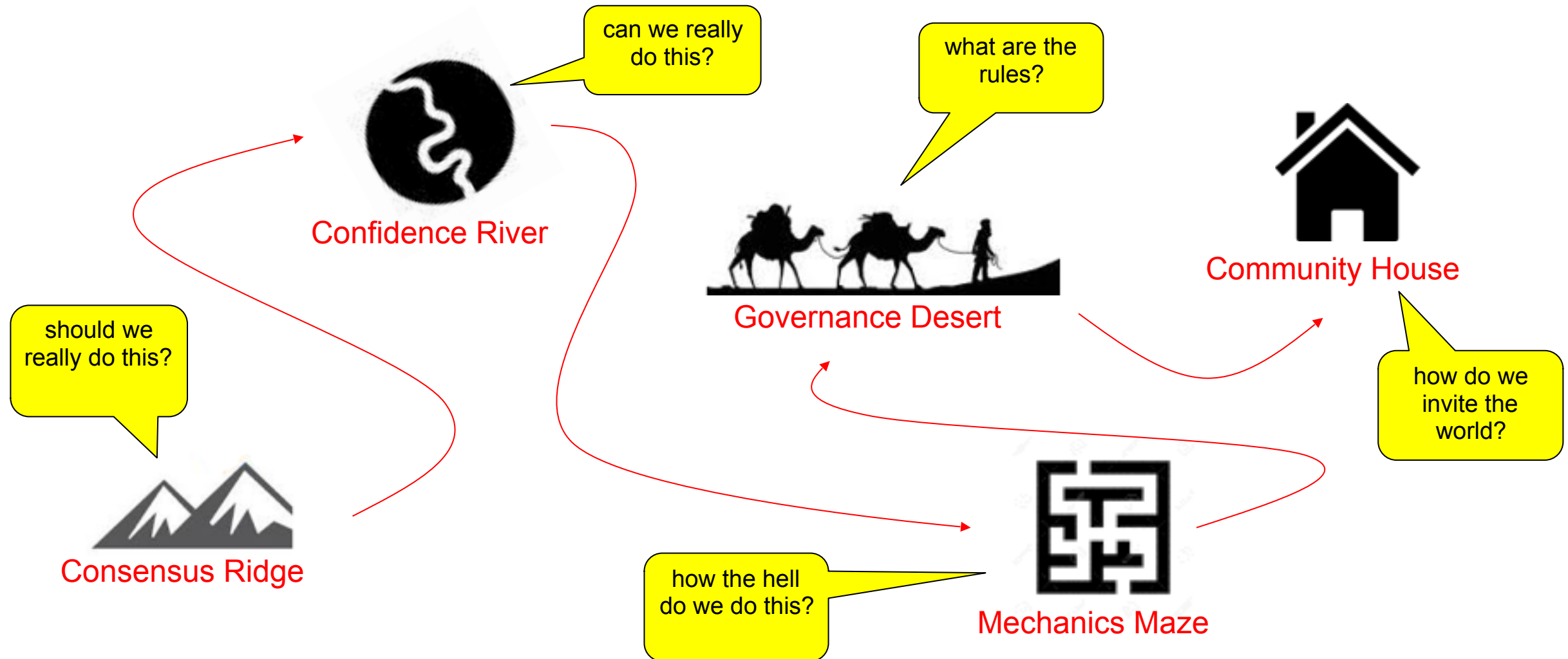

Stop 1 - Consensus Ridge



- should we even start thinking this new idea?

Stop 2 - Confidence River



- is our software good enough?
- is our program architecture modern enough?
- will we be able to find high-quality contributors?

Stop 3 – Mechanics Maze



- which online resources do we have to prepare? (homepage, Github, docker, forum, ...)
- how do we make our documentation easy-to-use in self-service mode?
- what resources do we offer for subscription customers?

Stop 4 – Governance Desert



- which license do we choose for the software?
- are all software components compatible with this chosen license?
- how do we describe the process for contributors?
- can we become part of an existing open source project?

Stop 5 – Community House



- How do we let the world know?
- How do we win over early-phase community members?
- Is our Community Management state-of-the-art?
- Can we join another Community House?

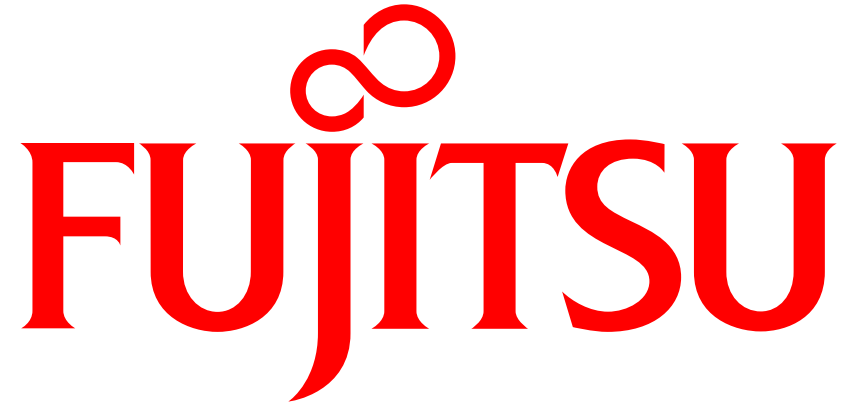
