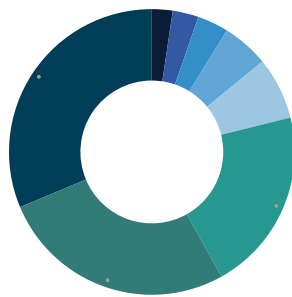


Post-Event Report

**26 June 2024 | London, England**

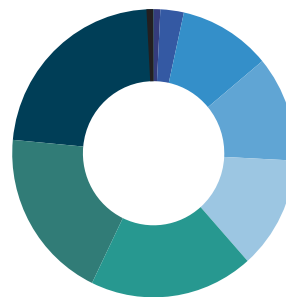

## Event Demographics



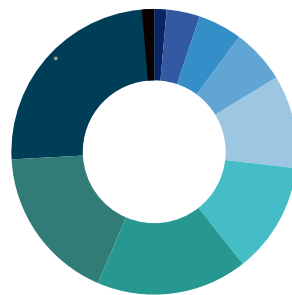

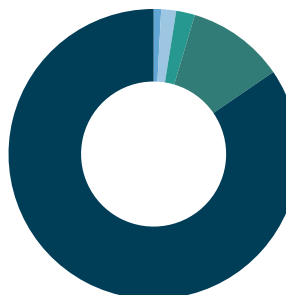

## Diversity & Inclusion

**28%** of all conference speakers identified as **women or non-binary**

**72%** of conference speakers identified as **male**

The Open Source in Finance Forum London received the highest rated Gold Badge from the CHAOSS D&I Event Badging Program, showing that we foster healthy D&I practices.



Our initiatives for diversity and inclusion included the following:

- **Registration Scholarships:** To encourage and increase the participation of a diverse community, we were pleased to offer diversity and need-based scholarships to this year's event. Full conference registration was covered for 14 recipients.
- **All-Gender Restrooms:** Specific restrooms were dedicated as all-gender for attendees who feel more comfortable using all-gender facilities.
- **Inclusive Speaker Orientation Course & Accessibility Resources for Speakers:** Presentation accessibility resources and access to the Linux Foundation's online orientation course to learn tips/tools to use when speaking to encourage inclusivity in presentations and messaging were provided to all speakers.
- **Nursing Room:** A private nursing room was made available at the event to aid in the comfort and accessibility for our nursing attendees.
- **Zen Zone:** A dedicated zen zone for sensory relaxation, meditation, and worship was available for all attendees. Attendees could go if, for any reason, they couldn't interact with other attendees at that time.
- **Communication Stickers:** Communication stickers were available for attendees to indicate their requested level of interaction with both other attendees and the press (including photographers and videographers).
- **Pronoun Stickers:** Pronoun stickers were available for attendees to share their pronouns with other conference attendees.

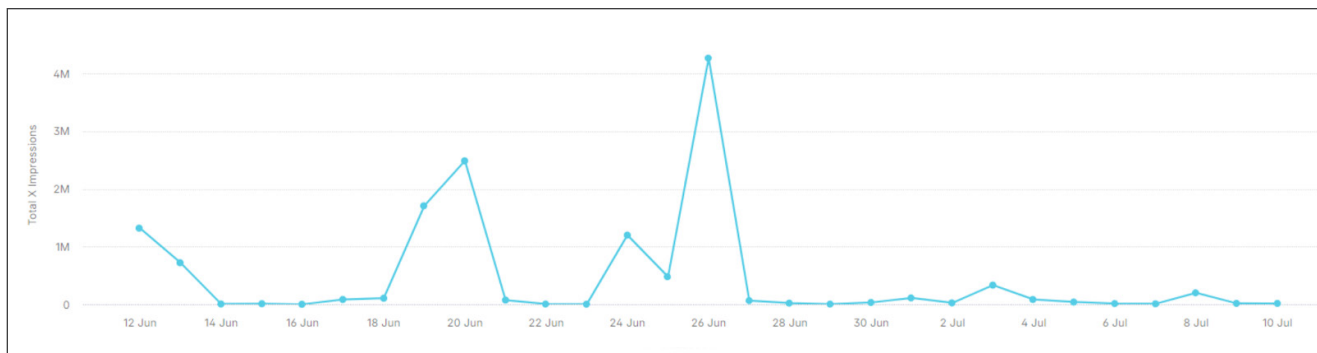
