

## **Creating new contributors**

## The 'easy' stuff

- Venue (space, desks/chairs, power, Internet access)
- Catering (programmers are easy to feed and water)
- Internal advertising

## The 'moderate' stuff

- Dates... dates, dates (conflicts and constraints everywhere)
- Mentors/leaders (interest, availability, travel)
- External advertising (many projects have no single place to advertise events)



## The 'hard' stuff

- Selecting projects (do what you're good at, not what's shiny)
- Attendees will not be prepared (but you can help)
- List of newbie-friendly issues/features/tasks (rely on mentors/leaders)
- Follow-up (tracking results can be difficult)
